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

- A reusable lunchbox or bag

No thanks

- X Food packed in plastic wrap, single-use plastic bags, foil or wax paper
- X Single-use drink boxes, cans, pouches, cartons and bottles
- X Single-use plastic forks and spoons
- Pre-packaged single-serve snack items

Safety Rules when Travelling on a School Bus

What <u>Must</u> I do when travelling on a School Bus.

- I must wear a seatbelt.
 Refusal to wear a seat belt may result in the student being refused Travel.
 Seatbelts are a legal requirement and must be worn.
- I must Stay seated.
 I must stay seated and wear my seat belt and only get up when I am approaching my stop.
- I must listen and follow the Bus Drivers directions.
 If a student continues to not listen to the Bus Driver and act in a disruptive manner the Bus Driver will put you on report which may result in the student being refused Travel.
- I must Show the Bus Driver my Bus Pass each time I Travel on the Bus or when requested and I will have it ready to show the Bus Driver before getting on the bus.

You **MUST** be deemed eligible to Travel from Home to School and School to home. If you are not eligible or refuse to apply for free Travel, you must pay a Fare or purchase a Term Pass.

- I must NOT Swear, Yell, Scream, Name call or Argue whilst on the Bus. Bad language, Bullying and Disruptive behaviour may result in the student being refused Travel.
- I must NOT ever Hit, Push or Spit whilst on the Bus.
 Violence is not tolerated and <u>will</u> result in the student being refused Travel.
- Do NOT tamper with or interfere with Equipment fitted to the Bus. Any Tampering with equipment fitted to buses will Not Be Tolerated and may result in student being refused Travel.

Note: All Misconduct Reports are investigated by Cavanagh Bus & Coach Managers and Contact made to Parents/Caregivers and Schools regarding the outcome of the investigation.
